Attention All Junior Pistol Shooters!

The NRA is pleased to announce that its annual **NRA Junior Pistol Camp** will be held **June 26- June 28, 2015**, at the **Canton McKinley Rifle and Pistol Club in Canton, Ohio**.

CAMP PROGRAM AND OBJECTIVES:

All pistol camp students will receive expert coaching in the fundamental principles and techniques of *conventional*, *international and Scholastic Pistol Program* pistol shooting. Students will be provided a safe, enjoyable learning experience that will significantly contribute to improving their shooting skills.

STAFF QUALIFICATIONS:

All instruction and coaching will be conducted by outstanding official **NRA Certified Coaches**.

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY:

The pistol camp has been primarily designed for the beginning and intermediate shooters. Shooters need to be **at least 12 years old**.

ADULT SPONSORSHIP:

Students who have not reached their **18**th **Birthday** by June 22, 2014, must be accompanied to the camp by an adult sponsor (age 21 or older). An adult may not sponsor more than **three junior students**.

LIMITED ENROLLMENT: Enrollment will be limited to 24 students.

REGISTRATION AND FEES: Registration forms and fees for camp will be accepted at NRA Headquarters on a first-come, first-served basis. For all mailed entries, the earliest postmarks will be used to determine order of acceptance. Registration fees cover all administrative costs and training materials. (The registration fees do not cover other costs such as travel and room and board.)

- Advanced Registration: The fee for advanced registration is \$225.00 per student, and must be received by the NRA not later than June 1, 2015.
- Standard Registration: The fee for standard registration is \$250.00 per student. This fee will be charged for students whose registration materials are received after June 1, 2015 (postmarks will determine acceptance of all mailed materials), or for students who register directly at the camp.
- In the case of cancellation by the camper, refunds will be issued less a 20% administrative fee.

All required entry forms for the pistol camp are enclosed with this letter, and consist of:

- Registration Form
- Health History Form (this form must be notarized)
- Required and Optional Equipment Form
- Lodging Information

• Special Power of Attorney Form (for students whose sponsor is not their parent)

Students should review all entry forms with their parents prior to submission.

The NRA will acknowledge all student entries in writing.

OTHER COSTS: Students are required to cover the cost of their room and board, plus all other incidental and personal expenses.

CANCELLATION OF CAMP:

The NRA reserves the right to cancel the pistol camp if a minimum of 10 students have not registered by June 1, 2015 Cancellation notifications will be mailed to each registrant if the camp is canceled. PASS THE WORD!

REQUIRED ITEMS

- 1. .177 Caliber (4.5mm) Target Air Pistol
- 2. .22 Caliber Smallbore Target Pistol with Metallic Sights.
- 3. Hearing Protection—Ear Plugs and/or Ear Muffs
- 4. Eye Protection—Shooting glasses, safety glasses or prescription safety glasses.
- 5. Cleaning Equipment
 - a. Cleaning Rod Guide
 - b. Cleaning Rod, Single piece, plastic coated recommended, with JAG.
 - c. 2-3 Bore Brushes, .22 Cal Pistol.
 - d. Bore Cleaning Solvent, 4-6 ounce bottle (if glass bottle, should be wrapped with several layers of masking tape to help prevent breakage)
 - e. 50-100 Bore Cleaning Patches
 - f. Toothbrush for pistol cleaning
 - g. Q-Tips for pistol cleaning
- 6. Ammunition: 500 rounds of standard velocity target ammunition plus 500 pellets.

OPTIONAL ITEMS

- Shooting Shoes (international).
- 2. Spotting Scope with stand or without stand for use in camp. (Recommend 20X min Power or Variable Power.)
- 3. Rain gear- rain suit or and 6' X8' light weight waterproof material for use to cover shooting equipment.
- 4. Stopwatch or electronic timer. A timer that will permit the count-down of hours and minutes is recommended

<u>Acceptable Pistol</u>—The camp will accept any .22 caliber target type conventional pistol that meets Rule 3.4 of the current NRA conventional pistol rules, and 3.7 Air Pistol and 3.5 Standard Pistol type International Rules. These pistols may be used in matches sanctioned by NRA Junior Camp.

NRA Pistol Rule 3.4—A pistol authorized for use in pistol matches using cartridges commercially catalogued as the .22 Long Rifle cartridges. The long barrel must meet NRA Conventional Rule 3.4. The matches for Standard Pistol and Sport Pistol must meet NRA International Pistol Rules 3.1 and 3.5. The matches for air pistol must meet NRA International Rule 3.7.

NRA/USA Progressive-Position Pistol rules are governed by 4.1-4.14. The Progressive - Position Pistol matches will use NRA/USA Progressive - Position rules.

The check-in committee must check in the Pistols authorized for camp matches. While the competitors are in the matches or at the camp for the Junior Pistol Camp the Range Officer has the right to reject any use of the pistols in the case of a malfunction or disabled pistol.

18 U.S.C. 922(x)

- (1) It shall be unlawful for a person to sell, deliver, or otherwise transfer to a person who the transferor knows or has reasonable cause to believe is a juvenile—
- (A) a handgun; or
- (B) ammunition that is suitable for use only in a handgun.
- (2) It shall be unlawful for any person who is a juvenile to knowingly possess—
- (A) a handgun; or
- (B) ammunition that is suitable for use only in a handgun.
- (3) This subsection does not apply to—
- (A) a temporary transfer of a handgun or ammunition to a juvenile or to the possession or use of a handgun or ammunition by a juvenile if the handgun and ammunition are possessed and used by the juvenile—
- (i) in the course of employment, in the course of ranching or farming related to activities at the residence of the juvenile (or on property used for ranching or farming at which the juvenile, with the permission of the property owner or lessee, is performing activities related to the operation of the farm or ranch), target practice, hunting, or a course of instruction in the safe and lawful use of a handgun;
- (ii) with the prior written consent of the juvenile's parent or guardian who is not prohibited by Federal, State, or local law from possessing a firearm, except—
- (I) during transportation by the juvenile of an unloaded handgun in a locked container directly from the place of transfer to a place at which an activity described in clause
- (i) is to take place and transportation by the juvenile of that handgun, unloaded and in a locked container, directly from the place at which such an activity took place to the transferor; or
- (II) with respect to ranching or farming activities as described in clause (i), a juvenile may possess and use a handgun or ammunition with the prior written approval of the juvenile's parent or legal guardian and at the direction of an adult who is not prohibited by Federal, State or local law from possessing a firearm;
- (iii) the juvenile has the prior written consent in the juvenile's possession at all times when a handgun is in the possession of the juvenile; and
- (iv) in accordance with State and local law:
- (B) a juvenile who is a member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the National Guard who possesses or is armed with a handgun in the line of duty;
- (C) a transfer by inheritance of title (but not possession) of a handgun or ammunition to a juvenile; or
- (D) the possession of a handgun or ammunition by a juvenile taken in defense of the juvenile or other persons against an intruder into the residence of the juvenile or a residence in which the juvenile is an invited guest.
- (4) A handgun or ammunition, the possession of which is transferred to a juvenile in circumstances in which the transferor is not in violation of this subsection shall not be subject to permanent confiscation by the Government if its possession by the juvenile subsequently becomes unlawful because of the conduct of the juvenile, but shall be returned to the lawful owner when such handgun or ammunition is no longer required by the Government for the purposes of investigation or prosecution.
- **(5)** For purposes of this subsection, the term "juvenile" means a person who is less than 18 years of age.

(6)

- (A) In a prosecution of a violation of this subsection, the court shall require the presence of a juvenile defendant's parent or legal guardian at all proceedings.
- (B) The court may use the contempt power to enforce subparagraph (A).
- (C) The court may excuse attendance of a parent or legal guardian of a juvenile defendant at a proceeding in a prosecution of a violation of this subsection for good cause shown.
